History of Nhaka Afrikan Worldview (NAW) Trust

Nhaka Afrikan Worldview (NAW) is a registered Community Based Organization. NAW started its operations on 1st of May 2005 in Manica Bridge area, ward 24 – Mutasa District with the focus to promote nutrition through the establishment of nutrition gardens, for orphans and vulnerable children and especially those infected and affected by HIV and AIDS. On 2 December, 2006 NAW was officially launched by the community in Ndorikanda Village. Alderman Clr. Gohwa and Ishe Ndorikanda officiated. In 2009 40 Youths were trained in building, carpentry, plumbing, electrical wiring and painting. Nutrition gardens continued on. In 2010 water harvesting projects started and by 2011, a total of 4 projects existed within ward 24. This was done to make the communities aware of the global warming issues and to take positive actions to address this burning question.
